The Easy-to-Please

"It's the thought that counts."

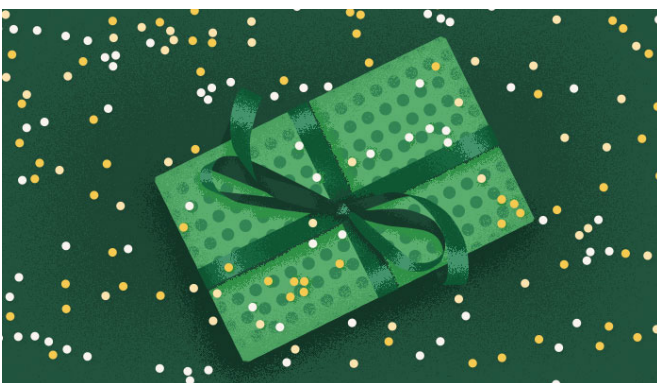
They're open-minded and gratified when you explain why you chose something with them in mind. They prefer personal connection over impressive brands.



The Tried-and-True

"I like what I know and I know what I like."

They want more of what they already enjoy. Don't worry about giving the same gift year after year if it's something they love.



The Enthusiast

"I can't wait to try it."

They're curious and adventurous, excited by variety, trends, and the latest version. They love samplers and discovering new favorites.



The Connoisseur

"I like the best, forget the rest."

They prefer quality over quantity and appreciate the most outstanding example of something. If they specify a brand, don't substitute.

GIFT-GIVING HACK

When you think of a great gift idea, make a note on your phone. If it's something you see, snap a photo or take a screenshot. You can also record a voice memo if you get an idea while driving or your hands are full.

Step 2: Generate Ideas

The best gift ideas come from paying close attention to the people in your life. These exercises will help you turn your observations into specific gift ideas. You don't need to complete every exercise—choose the ones that feel most relevant for each person you're shopping for.

GIFT-GIVING HACK

Listen for “someday” language throughout the year. When people say “someday I want to...” or “I’ve always wanted to try...” or “one of these days I need to...” they’re revealing desires they haven’t acted on. Keep a running note of these mentions—by the time you need a gift idea, you’ll have a list ready.

The Complaint Translator

GIFT-GIVING HACK

Gift cards don't have to feel impersonal. Try pairing them with something to create a theme: a nice mug with a coffee shop card, a fun tote for a bookstore card, a mini bottle of champagne with a restaurant card.

The Favorites Deep Dive

GIFT-GIVING HACK

A great gift doesn't have to also be a surprise. For big-ticket items or practical gifts, asking directly—"I'm thinking of getting you X, would you use it?"—can save you from an expensive mistake. As a bonus, once you know they want it, you can ask others if they'd like to split the cost. Some people actually get more excited knowing what's coming, and asking shows you care about getting it right.

The Identity Gift

① *How would this person describe themselves in their bio or introduction? (Parent, reader, gardener, coffee enthusiast, dog person, traveler, cook, etc.)*

GIFT-GIVING HACK

When someone shows you something they just bought or received, ask "How did you decide on that one?" Their answer reveals what matters to them—quality, convenience, price, brand, style—which tells you how to shop for them in the future.

GIFT-GIVING HACK

Take each child on a solo shopping trip to shop for their other siblings. Siblings are great at choosing gifts for each other, and you also get ideas for what that child would like to receive.

Step 3: Choose and Present

You've found the perfect gift—now how do you hand it over? Some people love opening gifts in front of a crowd, while others prefer a quiet moment. Some care about beautiful wrapping, others are fine with a reused gift bag from three birthdays ago. Think about what type of presentation would delight your recipient.

TIPS FOR PRESENTING YOUR GIFT

If your recipient is someone who appreciates cards, a thoughtful note can make a gift feel more meaningful. Here are some tips on what speaks to different gift appreciation profiles.



Easy-to-Please

Explain why you chose this gift and what made you think of them. “I saw this and thought of you because...” or “I know you love...” makes them feel seen and appreciated.



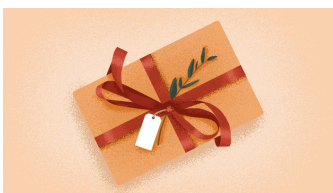
Tried-and-True

Keep it simple and warm. They appreciate tradition, so a straightforward “Happy Birthday” or “Thinking of you” works well. If you're giving them their favorite thing again, you can acknowledge it: “I know you love these, so here's another round!”



Enthusiast

Make it fun and build excitement. “I heard this is the hot new thing” or “I can't wait to hear what you think of this!” matches their energy for discovery and novelty.



Connoisseur

Highlight quality or thoughtfulness. “This is supposed to be the best” or “I did some research and this came highly recommended” shows you put in effort to find something excellent.

GIFT-GIVING HACK

Gift receipts: It's always a good idea to include one, especially for Connoisseurs and Tried-and-True receivers who may want to exchange for their preferred version. If it feels awkward to you, you can slip it into a card or attach it to a note saying “In case you prefer a different fit or color.”
